## Hope's Labor of Love

Abounding Hope - Week 3 (1-10-24)

## 1 Thes. 1:3

• Labor = Kopos - work; labor; toil; trouble; cut; reducing; pains; trouble

## I. Hope and Love

- A. Hope Hebrews 6:18-19
  - 1. "Which hope **we have**..." If you have Christ, you have hope! There is no hopeless situation with God. With Him all things are possible! (Mat. 19:26)
- B. An Anchor speaks to certainty and stability amidst rough waters.
  - 1. When we have full confidence in our anchor we are of one mind and are not easily swayed or tossed by the wind and waves of this world. (James 1:5-8)
  - 2. Stability breads stability. Hope is contagious.
    - a) Those who are weak and unstable can find refuge in those that are more stable.
      - (1) "Lean on me when you're not strong. I'll be your friend. I'll help you carry on."
      - (2) Remember that the only thing that won't ever let you down is Jesus. People have their faults and limitations, but the God in them does not!
- C. What does hope have to do with the labor of love?
  - 1. Jesus loved to His own hurt and death because He had hope.
    - a) Hebrews 12:2 (AMP) "[looking away from all that will distract us and] focusing our eyes on Jesus, who is the author and perfecter of faith [the first incentive for our belief and the One who brings our faith to maturity], who for the joy [of accomplishing the goal] set before Him endured the cross, disregarding the shame..."
    - b) How did Jesus have hope in spite of knowing what He would have to go through? (1) **He knew the Father**, and trusted Him and His plan.
  - 2. God loved us, therefore we have hope. Because we have hope we can love like God loves.
    - a) Romans 5:5
    - b) 1 John 4:16-19
  - 3. How can I stay anchored in Christ when love takes me to troubling waters?
    - a) Keep the object of your hope at the forefront of your mind.
    - b) Pray without ceasing never stop listening
    - c) Stay grateful rejoice in the Lord always and again I say rejoice
- II. What does the labor of love actually look like?
  - A. Luke 10:27-28
    - 1. The lawyer wanted to put stipulations on God's love, but God and His love have no limits.
    - 2. If we follow in this order, love God and then love your neighbor, then we can love like God loves. Even when it is hard.

- B. Ministry is not about WHAT is needed, but about WHO is needed.
  - 1. John 6:31-35
    - a) It's not what (the bread), it's who (Jesus IS the bread).
      - (1) He has already been given, it's already done. There is nothing more to receive than Jesus Himself.
  - 2. This applies to you personally and anyone that you may be ministering to. Family, friends, strangers it all applies the same.
  - 3. Our labor of love is about helping each other to look to Jesus for all of our needs.
  - 4. Do Not Forget that you are not anyone's savior, and whatever you are able to do for someone does not originate from you but from God!
    - a) 1 Corin. 12:4-7
      - (1) It all comes from the same source.
      - (2) The goal of ministry is never for anyone to be dependent on people, but solely on God. That can be from Him directly or through other people.
- C. The labor of love works from the inside out, making it much more intimate and vulnerable.
  - 1. It's easy to throw money at a situation. It's not so easy to walk with someone through their drug addiction, emotional instability, financial irresponsibility, etc.
    - a) God's love penetrates the heart, and allows the external corrections to come as a result of a healed heart
