The Gospel of The Kingdom - Week 14 (6-8-22)

2 Timothy 1:3-8

- I. Personal Development On Display
 - A. It starts with your own faith
 - 1. Much of the younger generations view Christianity as un-relevant or hypocritical
 - a) This is the kind of faith that they have witnessed
 - b) We need to be living a high-quality, genuine faith! "unfeigned faith" 2 Tim. 1.5
 - 2. Be willing to live/walk you faith in front of other people. Especially your kids and family.
 - a) Don't be afraid to let them see you struggle and have to rely on God.
 - (1) They need to see how you actually put your faith to work.
 - (2) James 2:17 "Even so faith, if it hath not works, is dead, being alone."
 - (a) Dead to you and everyone else that you could have influenced with the gospel.
 - b) Is your faith real? Is it your own faith? Or is your faith really someone else's?
 - (1) Why are you a christian?
 - (a) 2 Tim. 1:12 Paul says "...for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded..."
 - 3. Stay Full!
 - a) We need to keep ourselves so full of the spirit of God that we are overflowing on the people around us.
 - b) It should be obvious that we are full of God! 1 Peter 3:15 "...be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you..."
 - (1) They wouldn't be asking your if it wasn't obvious.
 - (2) When was the last time someone asked you about your faith or recognized something in you that displayed the gospel?
 - 4. Acknowledging what is in you
 - a) Philemon 1:4-7
 - (1) When we take time to acknowledge what is in us because of our faith in Jesus, we then can more effectively share the gospel
 - (a) We see the benefits of being saved, we see the power and authority that has been placed in us, we see that we are more than conquerers in a dangerous environment, we see that we can live a blessed and hopeful life no matter the circumstances, etc...

II. Intentionally Passing the Faith

A. Matt. 28:19

- 1. Wanting to share the gospel should come naturally, but Jesus still found it necessary to give us the command to actually make disciples. This we must be intentional about.
 - a) Teach = matheteuo to become pupil; to disciple

B. Trust the Holy Spirit to guide you

- 1. God always equips those that He calls!
- 2. Luke 12:12 "For the Holy Ghost shall teach you in the same hour what ye ought to say."

C. Consistency

- 1. Consistently Keeping our minds focused on the Gospel
 - a) Colossians 3:17 "And whatsoever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus..."
 - b) The more consistently we are focused on our savior the more likely we are to share about Him with other people that we encounter.
 - (1) "Creepy John"
 - (2) We like to talk about what we have been thinking about
 - (a) Rachel and her friends and family love to share any deals that they find online, because they get excited to share the blessing.
- 2. Exodus 12:26 "... What does this service mean to you?" (AMP)
 - a) Traditions/Rituals ways to incorporate our history, stories of God's Faithfulness, our Faith into the culture.
 - b) Great reminder and a means of teaching the future generations
- 3. Discipleship is hard, dirty work.
 - a) Jesus spent endless hours with His disciples taking advantage of every opportunity to teach them. All of them being very "rough around the edges."

D. Celebrating other people's faith

- 1. 3 John 4 "I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth."
 - a) Learn to take joy in other people's faith and development.
