## Filled to Overflowing

The Spirit of Life - Week 8 (12-15-21)

Sowing to the Spirit = being filled with the Spirit - Matt. 5:6

- I. The importance of being filled with the right things Galatians 6:7-10
  - A. Let's not be mistaken about what it means to be filled.
  - B. Having something with us and upon us is not the same as being filled with.
  - C. I'll let you decide which is the best choice. Eph. 5:18-21
  - D. When a person fills themselves with alcohol or drugs their nature changes.
  - E. No one becomes intoxicated with one sip
- II. He invites us to taste and see who and what we are about to be filled with. Psalm 34:8
  - A. How do we determine whether or not we like something? We taste it (We're not filled at that point)
  - B. The tasting is not to determine whether or not we like what God has called us to do or say and then opt-out; often it requires sacrifice.
  - C. When Jesus tasted death for us it was bitter Heb. 2:9-10
  - D. He sacrificed Himself and endured the bitter, so we could be better.
  - E. Hunger usually drives us to be filled.
  - F. Think for a moment about your very favorite food; doesn't that make your whole face happy?
  - G. While we are being filled is awesome, but when we are at the place of fullness we find contentment.
  - H. Christians often wrestle with the thought of contentment, whether it is good or bad 1 Tim. 6:6-10
  - I. It is just human nature when we feel content, we fall asleep (naturally and spiritually).
- III. What we put in our vessel reveals what kind of person we are. Matt. 12:33 (A positive identification)
  - A. We have to be careful about what we fill ourselves with. 2 Cor. 6:14-18
    - 1. What is on the inside will eventually effect the outside too.
  - B. We all know that if we put bad things in our body that is going to have a negative effect on us.
    - 1. What about bitterness, hatred, envy, strife, unforgiveness, all these things do to the spiritual man, what alcohol and drugs do to the natural man.
  - C. What about the drunken brethren church? Will they make it?
  - D. I'm really not advocating drunkenness here tonight, even though it has been referenced many times. On the contrary I want you to be filled with the spirit of God.
  - E. The bottom line is, the "thou shalt not's" of scripture points us away from what we don't need and points us toward what we do need.
  - F. We are vessels made by design to be filled only by our designer, not an imposter.

- G. It is not ok to just be filled with something, no more than it is to fill your gas tank with water.
- IV. Accountability for what God has blessed us with and called us to
  - A. Jesus taught us a lot about accountability in the parables He spoke.
  - B. The parable of the talents is a good place to start. Matt. 25:14-30
  - C. There are 25 or 30 parables you can read and study on the subject of accountability.
  - D. Remember we are accountable to the one who is counting on us.
