Thy Will Be Done - Week 8 (7-19-23)

Mark 16:15-18

- Thy will be done. The great commission. Who to worship, where to worship and how to worship. Jesus was engaged in the great commission. Her theology was flawed, so was ours.

I. 1. John 4:4=42, 13-26

- A. Verse 34 My meat is to do my Father's will.
- B. ("When we do God's will it feeds us.") Pastor Dave quote
- C. 2 Corinthians 5:17-18. All things are new.
- D. Revelation 21:5-7 All things are new.

II. Divine Appointments:

- A. New outlook, a burying of the old nature and a resurrection of a divine nature.
 - 1. 2 Peter 1:1-4.
- B. Psalm 103:12 The new birth is a divine nature reset. Hebrews 8:12
- C. Without having the mind of Christ, we will never rise above our own understanding .
Proverbs 3:5-10
- D. The Global reset the world reflects to, leads to death and destruction.
 - 1. (Satans plan for man).
- E. We don't look at death as a divine appointment, but nevertheless, it is an appointment.
- F. Psalm 116:15, Hebrews 11:9 precious in the sight of the lord is the death of his saints?
- G. Divine knowledge accompanies divine appointments.
- H. Without the yielding of our will, His will can never be accomplished.
- I. Christs submission to the Father will open the floodgates of heaven to whoever will come and take of the waters of life freely.
- J. What flood of blessings can be released when we say, Thy will be done?
- K. God has not appointed us unto wrath. 1 Thess. 5:9
- L. Divine appointments and assignments profit nothing unless we do them, there will not be a divine outcome. (Parable of the talents).
- M. Mark 16:15-18 (The Great Commission) includes every believer, but God has assignments specifically for us.

III. Divine Assignments: if we fail to show up at God's appointment with us, we might not get the assignment.

- A. If we really love like Jesus loves we will take on the task of a divine assignment when He calls.
- B. Jesus himself struggled with the assignment that the Father had given him, but He persevered and we are reaping the benefits of it.
- C. We must know and believe in truth and stand against everything that contradicts it.
- D. Christians should be remembered for what they stand for, not for what they stand against.

- E. We need to settle it in our minds what God asks us to do can't be done in our own strength, but in His alone.
 - F. A relationship with an reliance on the Trinity of heaven is key with any Divine Assignment. John 15:5-8
 - G. Jesus said in His ministry, I can do nothing apart from the Father; we too must utter the same words.
 - H. We are not self sufficient nor were we created to be; we are only sufficient in Christ.
 - I. We should be elated instead of deflated when God calls on us.
 - J. The words from the Father, Well done good and faithful servant towers over any and all opposition we might encounter along the way.
- IV. Divine Outcome: Obviously everyone is interested in a divine outcome, finishing well, running well, being victorious, but it is more than that; have we blazed a trail that others can follow?
- A. Very seldom if ever, when we are used of the Holy Spirit that it just pertains to us alone.
 - B. Whether it's an appointment or an assignment or just spending time in God's presence, it's time spent well.
