Troubling The Darkness - Week 12

John 7:37-39

I. Presence

- A. Feast of Tabernacles 1 of 3 great pilgrimage feasts
 - 1. All men were required to appear before God at the temple in Jerusalem.
- B. Temple in the middle of all the camps in the shape of a cross.
 - 1. Feast of Tabernacles also called Sukkot (plural form of Sukkah) = booth or hut.
 - a) Israel's wilderness dwellings
- C. The priest pouring water into the silver basin was looking forward to the outpouring of the Holy spirit.
 - 1. Gold pitcher pouring into a silver basin Gold represents wealth, wisdom, glory of God, presence of God
 - a) Silver represents purity, and redemption.
 - 2. Pool of Siloam
 - a) First mention in 2 Kings 20:20 King Hezekiah implements and aqueduct system to bring water into the city that poured into a big pool.
 - b) John 9:1-7
 - (1) Siloam = sent, sending out, gushing forth "the only spring within the walls"
 - (2) John 7:37-39
 - (a) using an "Aqueduct" to funnel the water/life of the Holy Spirit right into the walls of our being so that it can then gush forth and out to those that need it.
 - c) Moving water stagnant water has a tendency to get stale and collect dangerous pathogens that can eventually poison the once life-giving water.
 - (1) If there is no outlet for the supply of water will loose it's life-giving properties.
 - (2) Jeremiah 2:13
- D. Seven day celebration 7 = completion, perfection, wholesome.

II. Protection

- A. Brought safely out of Egypt
- B. Wandering in the dessert, protected by the pillar of fire by night and pillar of cloud by day Exodus 13:21
 - 1. They had to go where God led them. They had to follow His presence because that was where their protection and provision came from.
 - a) Romans 8:14 "For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God."
 - b) We must go with the flow of the spirit because that is where the supply is.
 - (1) Don't just stick to what is familiar. Go where God is taking you.
 - 2. Illumination of The Temple lighting of the Candelabra

- a) Remembering God leading them by a pillar of fire at night in the wilderness
- b) Represented the coming Messiah being a great light to the world and even to the gentiles
 - (1) John 8:12
- C. Numbers 23 & 24 Balaam You can't curse what God has blessed!

III. Provision

- A. Harvest Celebration end of their labors
 - 1. Jewish version of Thanksgiving
 - a) Sukkah also represented Harvest time dwellings
- B. With water comes vegetation and life.
 - 1. Isaiah 12
 - 2. Nehemiah 8:10 "...for the joy of the Lord is your strength."
 - a) This was spoken right before they re-established the Feast of Tabernacles.
 - 3. Jesus is the vine and we are the branches living off of his life supply John 15
 - 4. Jesus prayed, "And this is life eternal, that they might know Thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom Thou hast sent." John 17:3
