Troubling The Darkness - Week 14 (10-5-22)

1 Tim. 4:12-15

I. Made to be a light

- A. Matt. 5:14-16
 - 1. You are a light that was built and equipped for the purpose of being on display.
- B. James 1:16-18
 - 1. He is the father of lights and we are the children of God!
 - a) John 1:1-14 Jesus was a gift to the world (John 3:16), and He was the "light of men" (John 1:4). We were give the power to become the sons of God.

II. You Choose

- A. Our will and God's will
 - 1. Philippians 2:12-15
 - a) Amplified notes "God supports the believer, but it is the believer's responsibility to do what he/she has been called to do."
- B. 2 Tim 1:6
 - 1. "Gift" = a free (gracious) gift, endowment. Hebrew word Charisma
 - 2. "Stir up" = Keep in full flame
 - 3. "Quench not the Spirit" 1 Thess. 5:19 Quench = extinguish or put out a fire.
 - a) Don't a wet blanket to your own calling!
- C. Parable of the Talents Matt. 25:14-29
 - 1. We are not all expected to have the same gifts but we are all expected to invest those gifts back into the kingdom!
 - a) If the master coming back is representative of Jesus coming back after a long time, then we can expect to continue to serve God with our gifts in the millennial Reign.
 - b) You will get out of your calling what you choose to put into it!
 - (1) Don't sow sparingly 2 Corin. 9:6-8
 - (a) "...may abound to every good work." He's not just talking about money!

III. Make your calling sure

- A. 2 Peter 1:10
 - 1. We all have been called and given gifts and we all need to mature and develop in who God has called us to be.
 - 2. "give diligence" = hasten, be eager (Zealous)
 - 3. "Sure" = firm, stedfast, enduring
- B. Learn to value your calling
 - 1. You would not be here if you was not needed. God does not do anything for no reason, and He put you here at a specific time for a specific purpose.
 - a) Moses struggled to embrace what God was asking him to do, and God worked with him.

- 2. Your gifts and calling are not comparable to other people. What matters is your personal devotion to what you have been given.
 - a) 1 Samuel 16:7 "...for the Lord seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the Lord looketh on the heart."
- C. James 1:17 "...the Father of lights, with Whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning."
 - 1. God and His will never changes, and has chosen and called you for a specific purpose.
 - a) Therefore your calling and purpose is secure and unchanging, and is waiting for you to embrace it and grow into it.
- D. The Difference between King Saul and King David was the King David was very confident in his God While King Saul was very insecure in his own abilities.
 - 1. 1 Samuel 10-21-23 Saul hides from being installed as King after being anointed by Samuel.
 - 2. David allowed God to teach him through the challenges that he faced while Saul's character grew worse through challenges.
 - a) David knew his God intimately, and was able to grow into his calling.
 - (1) Perusing and growing in relationship with the one who has called us will bring us into our calling.
