# Wisdom is a Discerner

Walking In Wisdom - Week 4 (9-4-24)

## 1 Kings 3:9 and Hebrews 5:13-14

### I. The Nature of Discernment

- A. Discern
  - 1. To come to know or recognize mentally. To detect with your senses.
  - 2. Identify as separate and distinct.
- B. 1 Kings 3:9 byn separate; distinguish; understand; attend; consider; be cunning
- C. Hebrews 5:14 diakrisis distinguishing; estimation; discern; disputation
- D. Acts as a Filter
  - 1. Discerning right from wrong, true from false, good from better, better from best.
  - 2. 2 Corinthians 10:3-5
- E. Gets right to the root of matters
  - 1. Detect things accurately. Truly for what they are, and not just what they appear to be on the surface.
    - a) It sees things from God's perspective! The way that He sees them.

#### II. The Need for Discernment

- A. Deception
  - 1. The most dangerous lies are not the ones that go blatantly against the truth but the ones that look the most like the truth!
    - a) 2 Corin. 11:13-15
  - 2. 1 John 4:1-6
    - a) Any spirit that rejects, distorts, or distracts from the Gospel of Jesus Christ is of the spirit of antichrist.
    - b) What antichrists are in your life that need to be discerned and filtered out?
  - 3. Jeremiah 9:6 AMP "Your dwelling is in the midst of deceit [oppression upon oppression and deceit upon deceit]; Through deceit they refuse to know (understand) Me, says the Lord."
- B. "The enemy always attacks the message, the messenger, and the method."

#### III. The Impact of Discernment

- A. Protection from Deception
  - 1. John 8:31-32
    - a) Discernment is the filter and truth is the screen.
- B. Instrument of Healing
  - 1. Discerning in ministering to others.
    - a) Acts as the scalpel in surgery. Making fine, accurate cuts in order to correct and make right.
      - (1) Hebrews 4:12
      - (2) Wisdom discerns and is included in the Word of God.
  - 2. Discerning in leading yourself

- a) Galatians 6:7-8
- C. Catalyst to Spiritual Development
  - 1. Proverbs 14:6 "A scorner seeketh wisdom, and findeth it not: but knowledge is easy unto him that understandeth."
    - a) "Understandeth" = discern
      - (1) When we have discernment, knowledge comes easily.
  - 2. Discernment will help us to "zero in" on the things that need the most of our attention.
  - 3. 1 Corin. 2:12-16
    - a) We *compare* spiritual things with spiritual things.
    - b) They are spiritually *discerned*.
      - (1) The difference between the natural man and the spiritual man is that the spiritual man can judge (discern) both earthly and spiritual things.
      - (2) We can know the things that God has freely given us, and walk in them!
